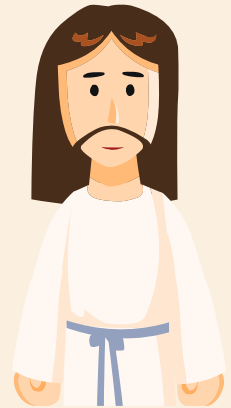
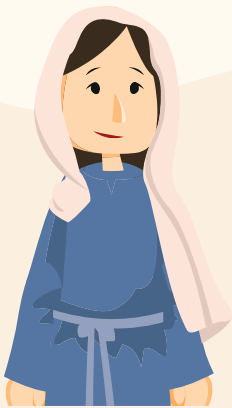

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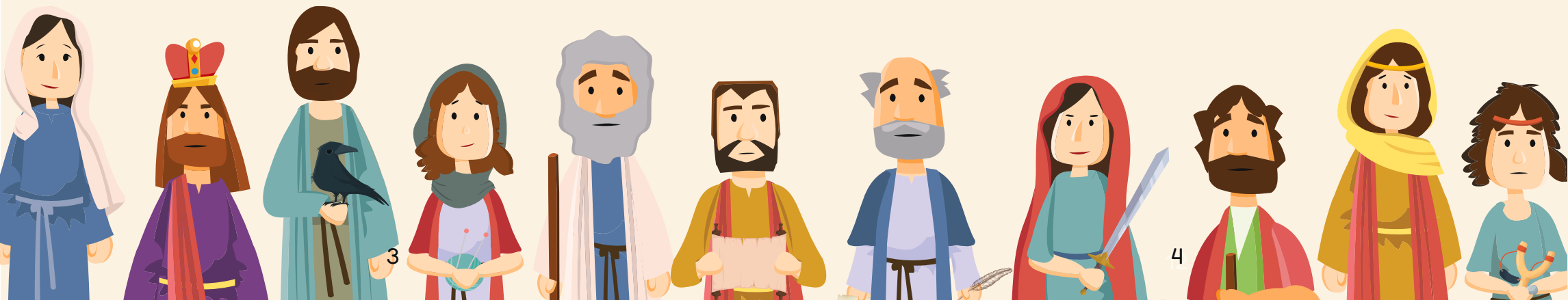

1 WHAT CAN I PRAY ABOUT?

Anything! God wants you to talk to Him about everything in your life! It can be about your family, your friends or what you did at the playground.

2 SHOULD I PRAY OUT LOUD?

God hears you no matter how soft or loud you pray.

3 HOW LONG SHOULD MY PRAYER BE?

You can pray for a few seconds or pray for hours! God listens, no matter how short or long your prayer is.

4 SHOULD I PRAY ALONE OR WITH FAMILY & FRIENDS?

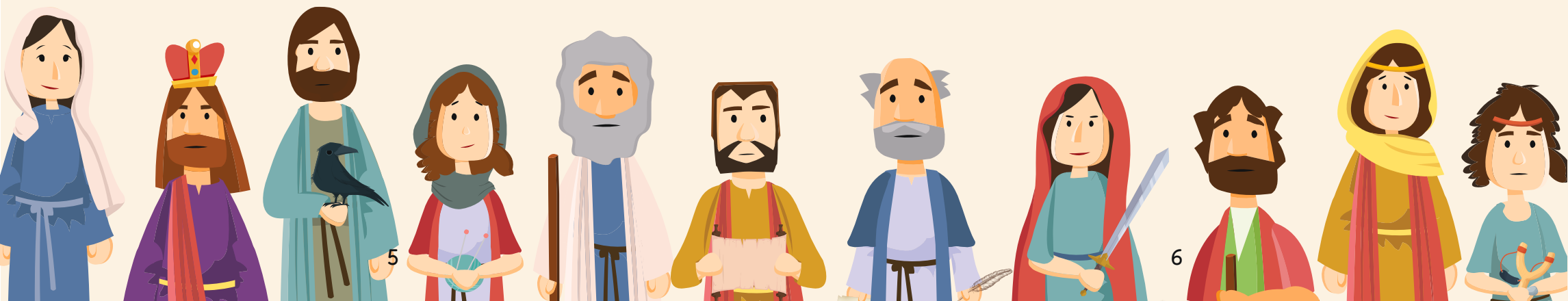
Jesus often prayed alone, but He also prayed with His family and friends. Praying with others can help build your faith. It can also make your relationships stronger!

5 SHOULD I PUT MY HANDS TOGETHER AND CLOSE MY EYES WHEN I PRAY?

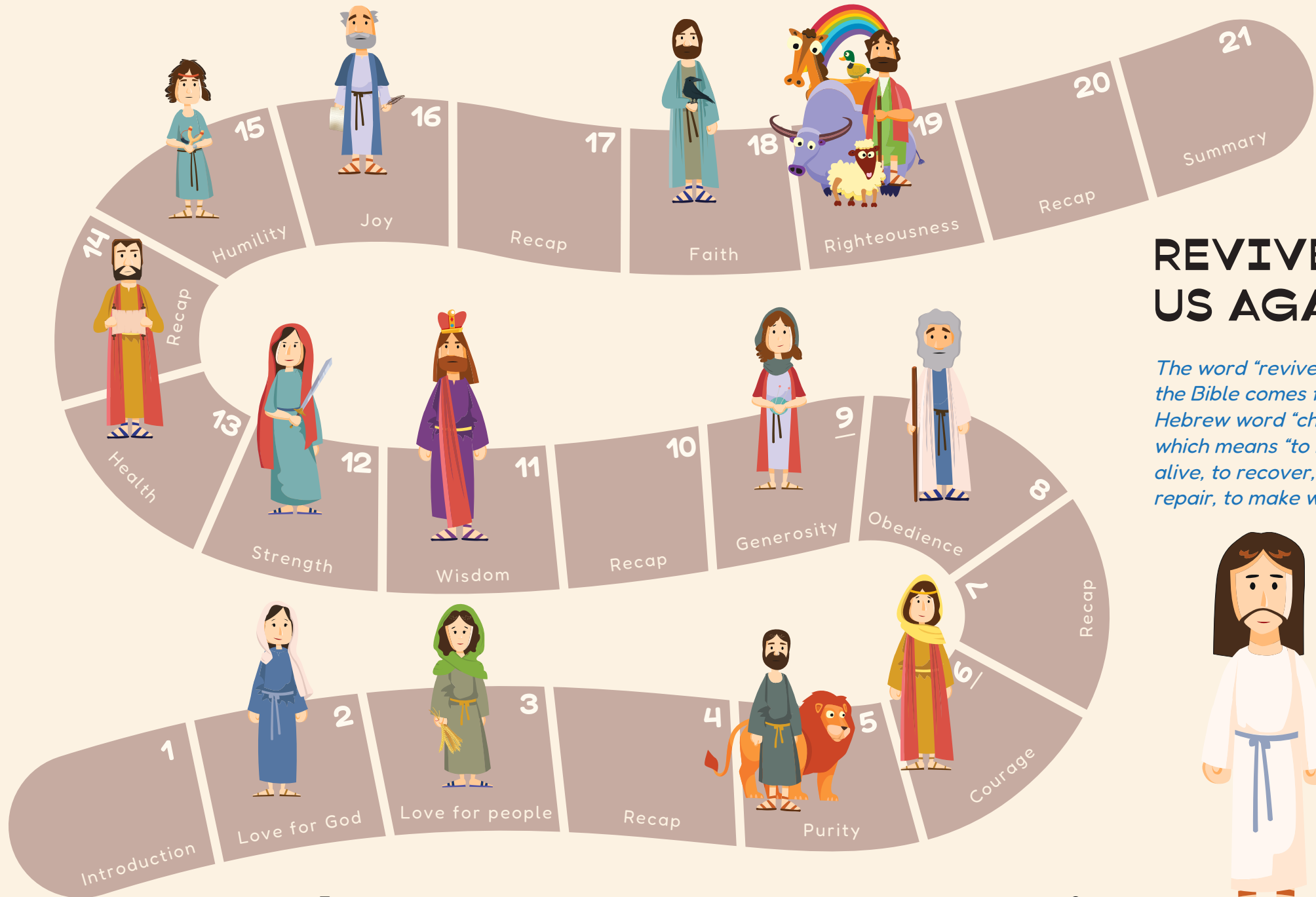
Placing your hands together and closing your eyes help you to focus better, but you don't always have to do so. You can talk to God when you are walking, sitting or even while showering!

You can pray to God ANYTIME and ANYWHERE! God is with you all the time, no matter where you are.

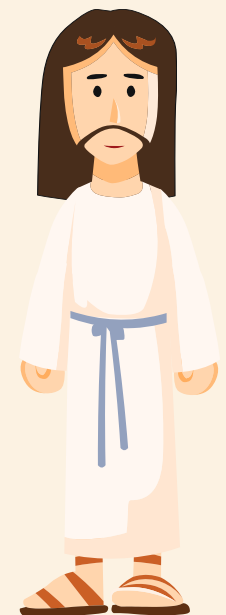

REVIVE US AGAIN

The word "revive" in the Bible comes from a Hebrew word "châyâh" which means "to make alive, to recover, to repair, to make whole."



GOD REVIVES US

VERSE

2 Corinthians 5:17 (NIRV)
When anyone lives in Christ, the new creation has come. The old is gone! The new is here!

THOUGHTS

Did you know that God made humans from the dust of the ground? He breathed life into that dust, and people became living beings. God is the one who gives life to everything. He can also make old things new. This does not mean He will turn back time and make us babies again. When God revives us, it means He:

- Gives us new things to do (new purpose)
- Gives us new ideas (new perspectives)
- Gives us new desires (new passion)

In the days ahead, we will explore how people in the Bible experienced God's revival.

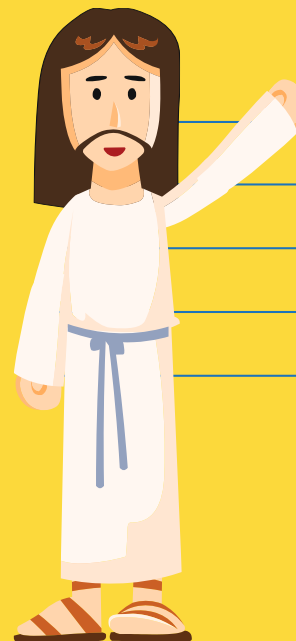


REFLECTION

DAY 2

REVIVE OUR HEARTS WITH LOVE FOR GOD

VERSE

John 12:3 (NIRV)

Then Mary took about a pint of pure nard. It was an expensive perfume. She poured it on Jesus' feet and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the sweet smell of the perfume.



THOUGHTS

Have you ever had to wash someone's dirty feet? It is not an enjoyable task, especially when you have to do it with your hair! In the scripture we just read, Mary willingly wiped Jesus' feet, which were probably covered with dirt from His long journey. Some people were unhappy with what Mary did. One of them said she should have sold the expensive perfume and given it to the poor. Another person felt that Mary should not be allowed to touch Jesus because she was a sinner. However, Jesus was pleased with Mary's action because her heart was filled with love for God. Just like Mary, we can love God in our own ways. Do not be afraid of what other people might think of you! You can spend time with God daily, sing songs of praises to Him and read the Bible to know Him more. These are some things that please God.

PRAY

- 1 Ask God to fill your heart with love for Him.
- 2 Tell God how much you love Him. You can tell Him how amazing you think He is!
- 3 Tell God some ways you would like to show your love to Him.

DAY 3

REVIVE OUR HEARTS WITH LOVE FOR PEOPLE

*John 15:12-13 (NIRV)
Here is my command.
Love one another, just
as I have loved you.*



THOUGHTS

We love others because Jesus first loved us. In the Bible (Ruth chapter 1), Ruth showed unwavering love and loyalty to her mother-in-law, Naomi. Naomi's husband died, and everyone else left her. However, Ruth chose to stay by Naomi's side through the difficult times. Though they were poor, Ruth faithfully followed Naomi wherever she went. God wants us to be loyal, kind and loving – like Ruth! God created people and He loves people. He wants us to show people His love. God can give us the ability to love others, even when it is hard.

PRAY

- 1 Thank God for loving you at all times, even when you are not on your best behaviour!
- 2 Ask God to show you the names or faces of some people who need love.
- 3 Ask God to show you some ways you can love these people.

DAY 5

REVIVE OUR HEARTS WITH PURITY

VERSE

Psalm 51:10 (NIRV)

*God, create a pure heart in
me. Give me a new spirit
that is faithful to you.*



THOUGHTS

God loves it when our hearts are pure and clean – just like how you would prefer a shiny, new toy compared to an old, dirty one. The Bible tells us a story about a young man named Daniel (Daniel chapter 1), who chose not to eat or drink the king's food and wine even though it was offered to him. Some of the food on the royal menu were considered unholy for God's people to eat. Daniel was a child of God, so he had to choose carefully. Daniel committed to remain pure even though it was not the popular choice. It was difficult, but his decisions brought honour to God. Just like Daniel, we need to be careful about what we allow into our lives. There are many attractive things the world offers that will cause us to sin and become unclean. To stay pure, pursue God and turn away from things that do not please God.

PRAY

- 1 Ask God to give you a clean heart.
- 2 Tell God 2 things you want to stop doing so that you can live a pure life (e.g. being rude to your parents, watching inappropriate content on YouTube, playing violent video games, telling lies, etc.)
- 3 Ask God for a steadfast spirit to resist the 2 things you mentioned above.

REVIVE OUR HEARTS WITH COURAGE

VERSE

2 Timothy 1:7-8 (NIRV)
God gave us his Spirit. And the Spirit doesn't make us weak and fearful. Instead, the Spirit gives us power and love. He helps us control ourselves. So don't be ashamed of the message about our Lord.



THOUGHTS

In the Bible (Esther chapter 3 to 8), Esther was called to make a tough decision: to be silent and let her people be killed, or speak up and risk losing her own life. In the end, her courageous response saved her people. Esther did not let fear stop her from doing what was right. In the same way, do not let your fear stop you from speaking the truth, helping others, or telling others about God! Small acts of courage can lead to big outcomes in the long run!

PRAY

- 1 Tell God what you are afraid of.
- 2 Ask God to give you courage.
- 3 Name 2 people in your life you can share God's love with (e.g. a family member, a classmate, a neighbour) and pray for them.

DAY 7

RECAP OF DAY 5-6

SUMMARY

Over the past 2 days we learnt that:

1. We need to remain pure by walking away from things that are wrong.
2. We need courage to speak the truth and do what is right.

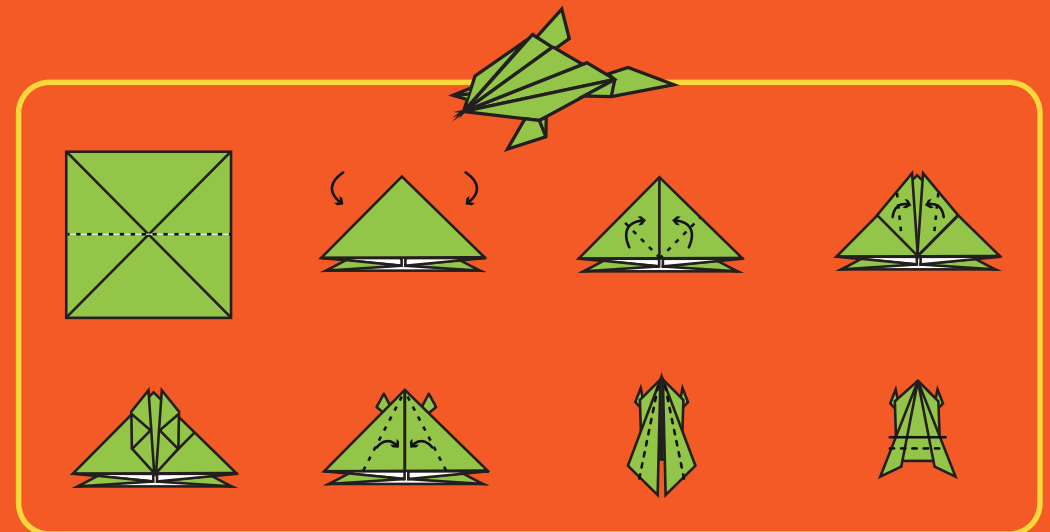
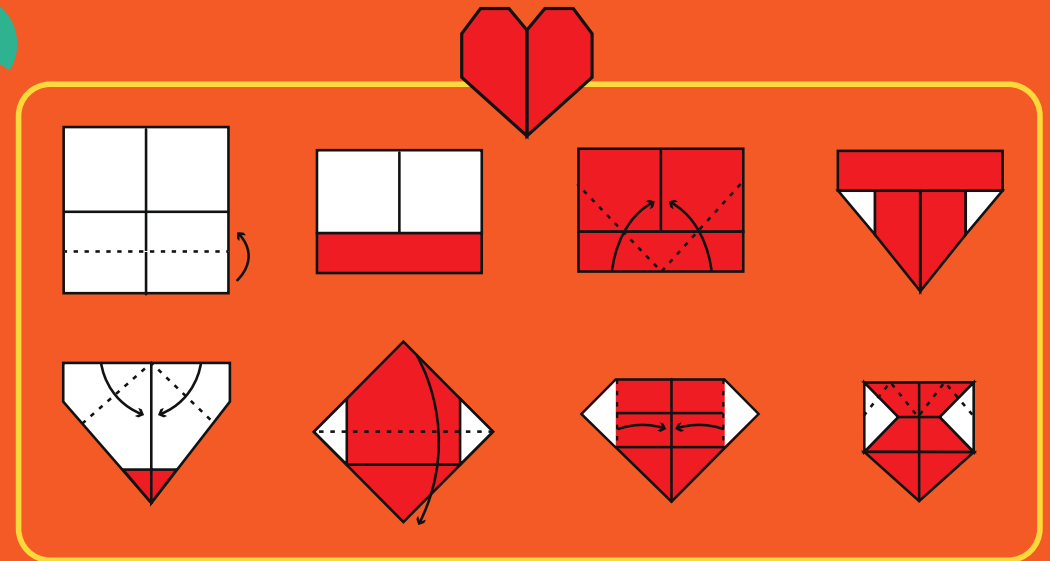

DAY 8

REVIVE OUR HEARTS TO OBEY

VERSE

*Luke 11:28 (NIRV)
Blessed are those who hear
God's word and obey it.*



THOUGHTS

In the Bible, Abraham was known for his faith and obedience to God. You can read about it in Hebrews 11:8-12, 17-19. Whether it was to move to a different country or give up his beloved son, Abraham trusted God and obeyed everything God told him to do. It was not always easy for Abraham to obey, especially when it required a sacrifice. However, he was willing to obey God because God was number one in his life. Pleasing God should be our top priority. God is our King – He requires our obedience. When we know God's character well and trust that He always has our best interest at heart, we will be willing to obey whatever He asks.

PRAY

- 1 Tell God how you feel about obeying Him (Are you nervous? Afraid? Happy? Sad?)
- 2 Ask God to revive your trust in Him.
- 3 Ask God to show you 2 things you should do to obey Him (e.g. pray everyday, encourage others)

DAY 9

REVIVE OUR HEARTS TO BE GENEROUS

VERSE

Proverbs 11:25 (NLT)
*The generous will prosper; those
who refresh others will
themselves be refreshed.*

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THOUGHTS

Have you heard of Tabitha (also known as Dorcas)? She was only mentioned once in the Bible (Acts 9:36-41), but her kindness and generosity were so important to God that it was written in the Bible: "she was always doing kind things for others and helping the poor." Just like Tabitha, you can be a channel of blessing to others too! You are never too young to start being kind and generous. Besides giving food, clothes and money to the poor, you can also give your time, talents, friendship and words of encouragement to others! God is a generous God, and He loves it when we give generously and cheerfully (read 2 Corinthians 9:6-8). He will bless you with everything you need so you can do more good works.

PRAY

- 1 Thank God for blessing you with many good things. Name them out as you thank Him!
- 2 Ask God to open your eyes to notice those around you who are in need so you can be generous towards them.
- 3 Ask God to teach you creative ways to bless others.

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DAY 10

RECAP OF DAY 8-9

SUMMARY

Over the past 2 days we learnt that:

1. We should listen to God's Word and obey it.
2. God wants us to be generous givers.

In order to grow, we need to allow God to stretch us in our obedience and giving. The more we obey and the more generous we become, the more God can use us! It is just like a rubber band; the more we stretch a rubber band, the more elastic the rubber band gets, the more things it can do!

Let's make a rubber band loom to remind us that we need to stretch and grow in our obedience to God and our generosity towards others.

REVIVE OUR MINDS WITH WISDOM

VERSE

*James 1:5 (ICB)
But if any of you needs
wisdom, you should ask God
for it. God is generous. He
enjoys giving to all people, so
God will give you wisdom.*



THOUGHTS

Solomon was the wisest man who ever lived. At a young age, he became king over Israel. In 1 Kings 3:9-10, God asked Solomon what he wanted. Solomon did not ask for money or fame. Instead, he asked God for wisdom. Solomon could have gotten anything in the world, but he was not greedy. God was pleased and granted Solomon's request for wisdom. Wisdom is not the same as being smart. Wisdom is having the ability to tell what is right from what is wrong and being able to make the right choice. God wants to give us wisdom so that we can live in a way that pleases Him. All we need to do is ask!

PRAY

- 1 Just like Solomon, pray and ask God to give you wisdom!
- 2 If there is a situation in your life in which you do not know what to do, ask God to show you the right way.
- 3 Ask God to help you use this wisdom to teach others what is right and do what is right.

REVIVE US WITH STRENGTH

VERSE

Judges 5:31b (NIRV)

– From The Song of Deborah

"May all who love you be like the morning sun. May they be like the sun when it shines the brightest." So the land was at peace for 40 years.



THOUGHTS

During the time when Israel had no king, God chose Deborah to lead Israel. God gave her wisdom to help the Israelites defeat their enemies. Deborah often worshiped God by singing songs to Him. Worshiping God gave her strength, endurance, and encouragement. Just like Deborah, we should worship God all the time – on our good days and on our not-so-good days. When we worship, God hears us. He will give us strength to persevere. When we worship, God is exalted high, and He will fight our battles for us. When we worship God with all our hearts, we will shine bright like the morning sun.

PRAY

- 1 Take some time to worship God. Sing 1 or 2 songs to Him.
- 2 Tell God the problems you may be facing (e.g. discouragement, disappointment, depression, etc).
- 3 Pray and ask Him for strength to endure through the hard times.

REVIVE US WITH HEALTH

VERSE

Isaiah 53:5 (ICB)

But he was wounded for the wrong things we did. He was crushed for the evil things we did. The punishment, which made us well, was given to him. And we are healed because of his wounds.



THOUGHTS

Hezekiah was one of the kings of Judah. He had a close relationship with God and was obedient to follow the word of God. One day, Hezekiah fell very ill and was about to die. Hezekiah was sad, but he chose to pray to God. He knew that God is merciful and kind. God heard Hezekiah's prayers and added fifteen years to his life (2 Kings 20:2-6). The God that prolonged Hezekiah's life is the same God we worship today! If God can revive Hezekiah's health, He can bless you with good health too! God can heal our bodies, our hearts, and our minds. Nothing is too difficult for God to heal! We may not always understand how and when God heals, but we can always trust that He desires to make us whole again.

PRAY

- 1 If there is an area in your life that needs healing, tell God about it. It could be a physical sickness, an emotional hurt or mental illness.
- 2 If you are well, thank God for good health.
- 3 Pray for someone you know who is sick. Then check on how he/she is doing.

DAY 14

RECAP OF DAY 11-13

SUMMARY

Over the past 3 days, we learnt that God hears and answers prayers:

1. Like Solomon, we can ask God for wisdom.
2. Like Deborah, God revives our strength when we worship Him.

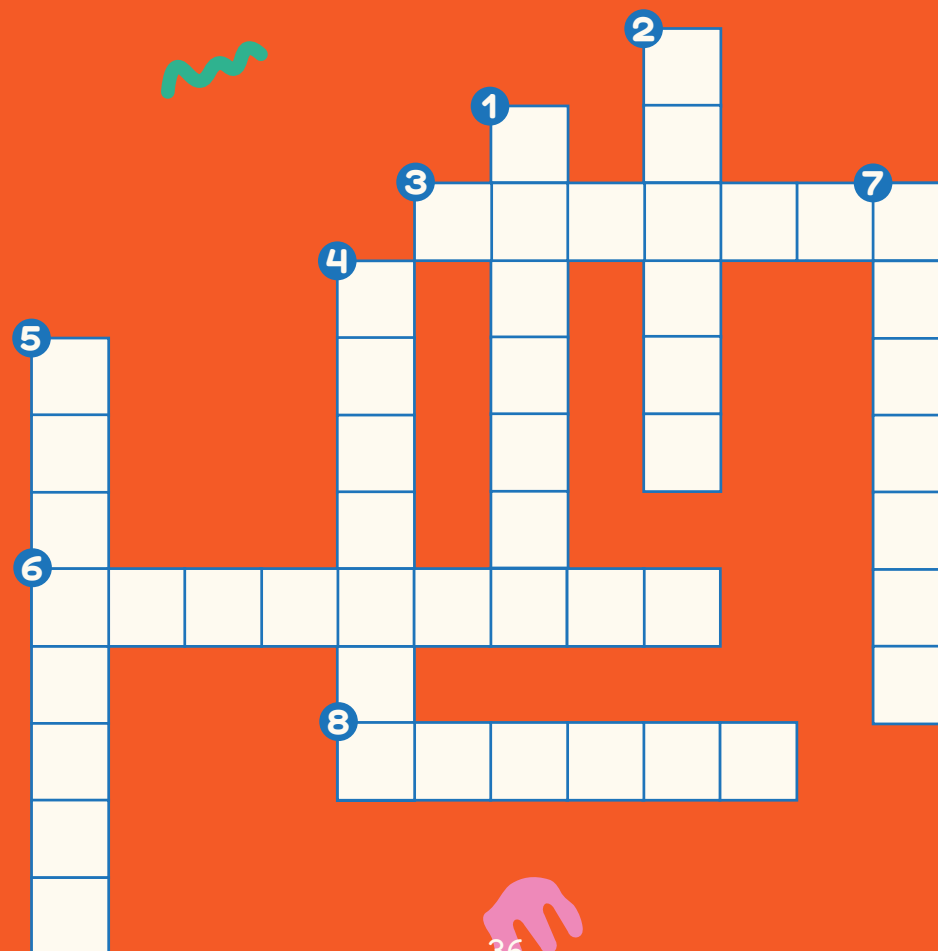

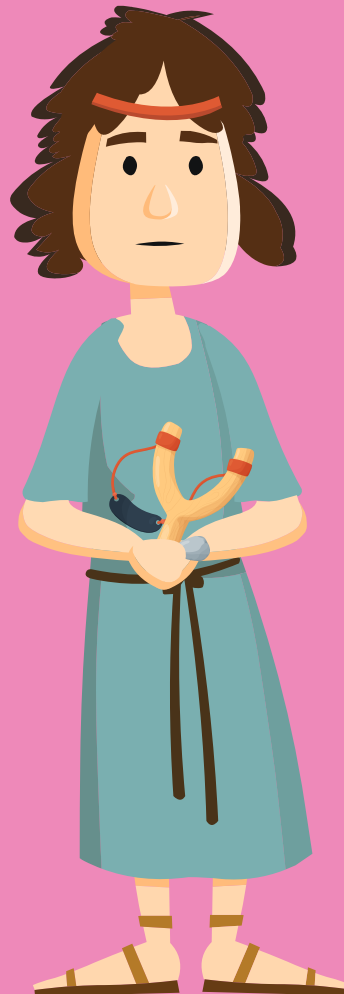


DAY 15

REVIVE US HUMILITY

VERSE

Philippians 2:3-4 (NLT)
Don't be selfish; don't try to impress others. Be humble, thinking of others as better than yourselves. Don't look out only for your own interests, but take an interest in others, too.



THOUGHTS

David was being hunted down repeatedly by King Saul. However, when David had the chance to kill King Saul he did not (1 Samuel chapter 24). If David had gotten rid of King Saul, he could have solved all his problems and immediately become the king. Instead, David chose to be humble and respected King Saul. David was not proud – He trusted God's timing and waited patiently for his turn to be king.

The meaning of humility in the Bible is to think less of ourselves and submit to God's will. This means we choose God's way above our own preferences. Although it might be difficult to display humility, especially when we want to hold onto our anger, remember that humble living according to God's way will bring the best outcome for our lives.

PRAY

- 1 Acknowledge that everything you have belongs to God. Thank God every day in your prayers.
- 2 Ask God to remove any pride in your life.
- 3 Tell God that you are willing to submit to His plan for your life.

DAY 16

REVIVE OUR JOY

VERSE

James 1:2-3 (NIRV)
*My brothers and sisters,
you will face all kinds of
trouble. When you do, think
of it as pure joy. Your faith
will be tested. You know
that when this happens it
will produce in you the
strength to continue.*

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THOUGHTS

There is a character in the Bible named Paul who went through many hard times, some examples include:

- Severely beaten then thrown into prison
- Shipwrecked 3 times
- Bitten by a poisonous snake
- Whipped 39 stripes 5 times
- Beaten with rods 3 times
- Lacked food, water, sleep, and proper clothes on some occasions
- Received many death threats

Despite all that, Paul was still able to praise God. Paul had true joy that remained even through tough times. He knew God was by his side and trusted that God would work all things out for his good (Romans 8:28). In the same way, you can have joy because God will work all things out for good for you when you follow Him. He knows how things will end, so you can trust Him. He is powerful! He can change your situation in an instant! The next time you face a difficult situation, choose to praise God. You can be joyful because God is always with you. He will never leave you.

PRAY

- 1 Start by praising God out loud.
 - Praise Him for what He has done (e.g. He blessed you with family, friends, a home, etc.)
 - Praise Him for who He is (e.g. He is almighty, a faithful God, wonderful friend, healer, etc.)
- 2 Ask God to fill your heart with joy.
- 3 Instead of complaining about your problems, tell God that you trust Him to work all things out for good.

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DAY 17

RECAP OF DAY 15-16

SUMMARY

ITEMS NEEDED






- 1 x1 Set of pick-up sticks

ACTIVITY

Let's practise praising God in every situation by playing this simple 'praise-up sticks' game with our family. Each coloured stick represents something to thank God for.

- 1 Gather all the sticks and hold them up vertically.
- 2 Release your hand and drop the sticks on the table.
- 3 Chose a stick to pick up and do so without moving the other sticks.
- 4 Once you successfully pick a stick up without moving other sticks, refer to the colour chart below and thank God for something!
- 5 If you move another stick while picking up the stick you have chosen, put the stick back into the pile. Your turn ends, and the next player gets a turn to try picking up a stick.
- 6 Play until all the sticks have been picked up. The player with the most praise-up sticks wins!

COLOUR CHART

	Yellow = Thank God for a person
	Red = Thank God for a food/drink
	Green = Thank God for a time in your life
	Blue = Thank God for something in nature
	Other colours = Thank God for anything

REVIVE OUR FAITH

VERSE

Hebrews 11:6 (NIRV)
Without faith it is impossible to please God. Those who come to God must believe that he exists. And they must believe that he rewards those who look to him.



THOUGHTS

Faith is essential in our walk with God. God is pleased when we put our faith in Him. Hebrews 11:1 (ICB) tells us that faith is knowing something is real even if we do not see it. In the Bible, Elijah was able to perform many miracles because he had complete faith in God. (Look at 1 Kings 17:1, 17:14 and 18:37-38 to read about some of the miracles that Elijah did!) There will be times we may ask God for things that are humanly impossible, like recovering from a sickness instantly, or for someone who does not believe in God to believe in Jesus. However, nothing is impossible for God to do (Luke 1:37)! God wants to use you to do miracles the same way he used Elijah, so that people will experience the power of God and know He is real.

PRAY

- 1 Tell God about something you are believing for that is impossible (something good).
- 2 Ask God to increase your faith.
- 3 Tell God that you believe He can do anything.

REVIVE US WITH RIGHTEOUSNESS

VERSE

1 Corinthians 10:13 (NIRV)
You are tempted in the same way all other human beings are. God is faithful. He will not let you be tempted any more than you can take. But when you are tempted, God will give you a way out. Then you will be able to deal with it.



THOUGHTS

Noah lived in a time when people were evil, corrupt, and violent. The Bible said in Genesis 6:9 (NLT) that Noah was the only blameless person living on earth at that time. Noah was surrounded by people who were doing wrong things, yet Noah remained righteous. This might be true for you too. Perhaps the people around you are constantly using vulgarities, lying to get out of trouble, or cheating on tests. At times, they may even persuade you to do what they are doing! However, as a child of God, you must not give in to the temptation to sin. Noah was able to stay righteous because he was close to God. When you have a close relationship with God, God gives you the ability to stand firm and do what is right, even when others make fun of you for being different.

PRAY

- 1 Ask God to forgive you for the times you have done something wrong.
- 2 Tell God that you desire to have a close relationship with Him.
- 3 Tell God about anything that is tempting you and ask Him to give you the strength to overcome it.

RECAP OF DAY 18-19

ACTIVITY

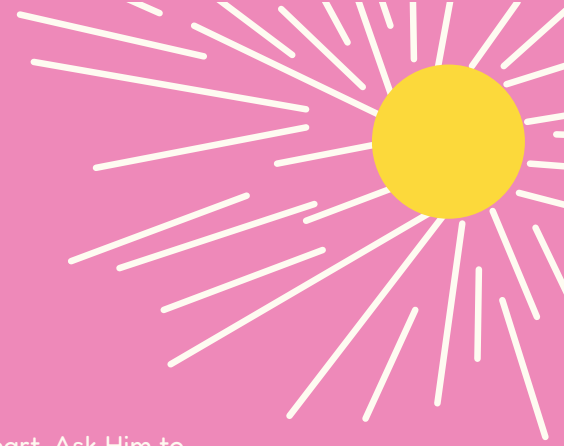
Let's build an obstacle course with our friends and family members to remember what we have learnt.

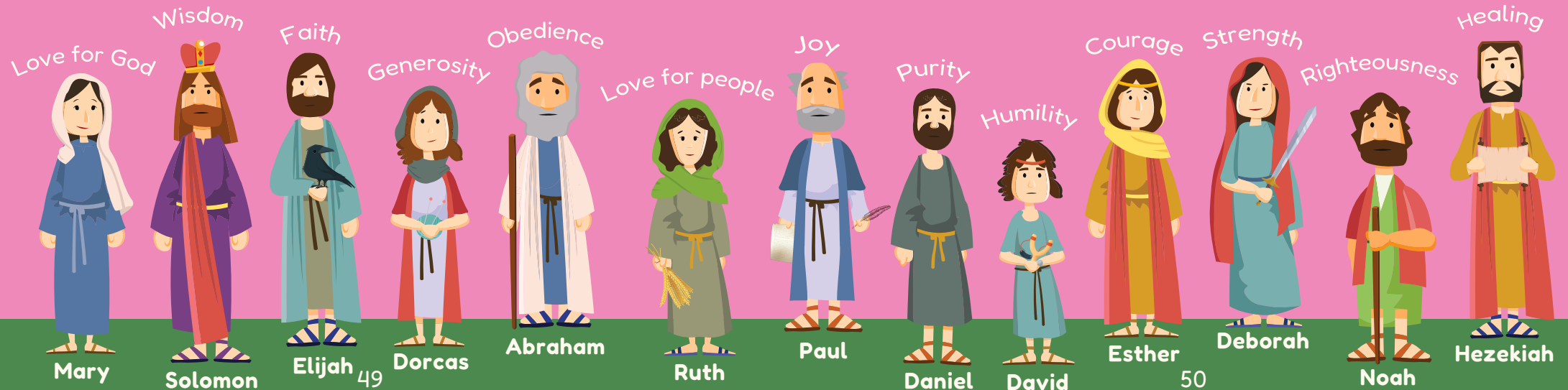

Continue to ask God to search your heart. Ask Him to help you recognise what you need to work on every day.
