Introduction

1. Receiving salvation by believing that Jesus paid the price for all of our sins is the greatest life-changing event we will ever experience!
2. While following Jesus is a personal decision, it is also one that we proclaim publicly and share with those around us. The Gospel is for everyone!
3. As Christians, we openly share with others about how we came to know the Lord and decided to give our lives to Him, in order to draw pre-believers to Christ and encourage fellow Christians.

I. THE POWER OF YOUR TESTIMONY

Every believer has a story.

Your story is powerful.

For I am not ashamed of this Good News about Christ. It is the power of God at work, saving everyone who believes—the Jew first and also the Gentile. Romans 1:16

Your story doesn't need to be long or complicated.

1. Share with others what Jesus did for us on the cross (1 Corinthians 15:1-4).

I passed on to you what was most important and what had also been passed on to me. Christ died for our sins, just as the Scriptures said. He was buried, and he was raised from the dead on the third day, just as the Scriptures said. 1 Corinthians 15:3-4

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2. Share with others what Jesus is currently doing:
 - In your life (1 John 1:7, 9)
 - Through your life
 - For your life (John 14:13-14)

II. EFFECTIVE TIPS TO SHARE YOUR STORY

Keep it concise

Show the “Before”

Show the “How”

Show the “After”

Other practical tips

1. Have a theme.
2. Point listeners to Christ – He is the one that made the difference.
3. Share your story with enthusiasm and excitement.
